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NURSERY THIS TERM

In Summer 1, we focused on learning about the stories "Dear Zoo," "Teeny Weeny Tadpole," and "The Very Hungry Caterpillar". We explored zoo animals and learned a Dear Zoo song, which the children enjoyed. Each child made their own animal and wrote a letter to the zoo. We also discussed pets as friends and asked the children to bring photos of their pets to share with the class.

The "Teeny-Weeny Tadpole" story taught us about the life cycle of a frog, starting from a little egg. We also discussed the life cycle of a butterfly through "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" story. We were fortunate to have live caterpillars in our class, and we watched them grow and transform through the different stages of their life cycle. This led us to a mini-beast hunt in the garden and field, where the children showed us their knowledge and excitement, especially when they found fat worms or colourful butterflies.

We had an exciting time creating a wormery in our garden and making mini-beast gardens with parents. The children also enjoyed spending time in the garden, playing with water, and cooking in our mud kitchen. They have been working hard to plant lots of vegetables and flowers around the garden and are looking forward to watching them grow.



NURSERY THIS TERM

We have been making a lot of changes in our garden. We're adding a new playdough station to improve motor skills, a new message centre for drawing and writing, and our own waterfall, with the garden being an ongoing project. We can't wait for more to come.



We ended the term with our amazing minibeast display. We are touched and want to extend a huge thank you to all our lovely parents who got involved in this project and helped their children understand the world of minibeasts.



RECEPTION THIS TERM

During this exciting term in Reception, the children had the opportunity to learn about different minibeasts found in the garden and the plants that appear in the Spring season. They witnessed caterpillars turning into butterflies and learned about their life cycle, as well as the life cycle of a frog in our pond. The children planted sunflowers, pumpkins, and beans, as well as growing herbs and many flowers in our garden area. They learned that plants need air, sunlight, warmth, water, and nutrients from the soil to grow, and studied in detail the parts of plants, including roots, stems, leaves, flowers, and petals. We made the most of the beautiful weather and spent lots of time enjoying outdoor activities, such as constructing, playing games, planting, or simply relaxing and reading by the pond.



RECEPTION THIS TERM

Sunflowers Art Exhibition

The children learned about Vincent van Gogh and created famous "Sunflowers" inspired sketches, drawings, paintings, and collages. A highlight of this half-term was the pottery workshop, where the children used the pinch pot technique to make vases and flower pots. At the end of the half-term, all the artwork was displayed in the Art Exhibition, which was a resounding success. Thank you to everyone who attended.



YEAR 1 THIS TERM

This term we have been very busy in Year 1. In Writing this term we have written our own version of The Way Back Home by Oliver Jeffers. Then we made some delicious cupcakes and we will be writing instructions on how we made them.

In Maths we have been learning to count in 2's, 5's and 10's and used 100 squares to identify the patterns each one made. We have also been looking at equal groups and working on identifying equal groups. Now we are looking at finding halves and quarters of shapes and quantities. We are using physical objects to help us with identifying halves and quarters. This included having shapes cut into halves and quarters to support our learning.

In Science this term we have been learning all about plants. We have been looking around the school for different types of plants and recognising deciduous and evergreen trees. We have also looked at the parts of a plant and what each part does to help the plant grow. We will also be planting our very own plant to look after and grow at home.



On Thursday 9th May, Year 1 visited Kew Gardens. This term we are learning all about plants. So we went along to Kew Gardens to have a look at the different plants.

We had a session called 'Colours and Seasons' where we learnt about the different seasons and what happens in each season. As well as the different colours you could see at Kew.

We then looked at some drawings done by Monet and had the chance to draw some of the plants and flowers in front of us using his style of art. Then we had the opportunity to collect some of the petals from the ground to stick onto our picture. We created some fantastic drawings!

We also had the opportunity to look around Kew Gardens, we visited the Palm House, Princess of Wales Conservatory and the Treetop Walk to name a few. It was a fantastic day and the weather was wonderful. We cannot wait to use the knowledge we have gained to write about the four seasons.



YEAR 1 THIS TERM

In History this term we have been looking at the Victorian Era. We learnt all about Queen Victoria and how they lived back then compared to our lives now. We also based our class assembly on the Victorian Era it was great fun learning about the schools in the Victorian Era. To end our unit we had a Victorian Day where we came to school dressed as Victorian children. The classrooms were set up like a Victorian classroom and we did work like the children of that Era. We were writing on black paper to represent chalkboards and we used white pencils/chalk to represent what they used to write with. It was a fantastic day had by all!



YEAR 2 THIS TERM

Year 2 have been learning about Coastlines, the features of a coastline, how they change over time due to erosion and how this can be prevented. In Geography we carried out a demonstration using sand and water to make a coastline, blocks to represent buildings and a chain of blocks to represent the riprap. When we created waves without the riprap the sand washed away quickly and easily showing us a faster process of erosion, we observed as the waves got stronger the coastline was shrinking and the buildings were washed away or collapsed. When we created waves with a riprap in place we saw that the sand didn't move as much, there was a barrier between the waves and the buildings, they were protected. As a class we were able to identify that we would need a strong riprap in place to prevent or slow down coastal erosion and preserve coastlines. We found this lesson fascinating and had so many fantastic questions to ask.



YEAR 3 THIS TERM

Year 3 has been studying the water cycle in geography. They created beautiful posters to illustrate each stage and also participated in group activities to act out the different stages. In art, children have been honing their botanical art skills through drawing and weaving. In maths, they learned about different units of measure such as cm, m, km, g, kg, ml, and I. Additionally, in writing, they crafted a narrative story about Goldilocks and the Three Bears and wrote a persuasive letter to Ms. Edwards, advocating for something they would like to see implemented in their school.



YEAR 4 THIS TERM

It's been a busy term in Year 4 at William Byrd! We started the term by reading our new text Anglo-Saxon Boy by Tony Bradman. This has been a favourite of ours as we already have so much prior learning about the Anglo-Saxon's and the Vikings from our history unit from the Autumn term. We've really enjoyed reading this text together and learning new facts.

In Writing we also had a history focus, with our text about the Great Plague. This was a fabulous learning opportunity as we able to compare our life during Covid-19 to those who lived during the Great Plague. Our final write was diary entry where we had to pretend we were living through the plague and write a diary entry about what we were experiencing. They were an interesting read and we are very proud of what we achieved.

The best part of this term however was PE and our NFL lessons. We've been learning the rules and skills of NFL since the Spring term and we were finally able to put our skills to good use. We completed in the William Byrd NFL competition and came third! We were very happy with our result.




YEAR 5 THIS TERM

This half term Year Five had the enriching opportunity to visit London Zoo to embed and further develop their learning from their previous Science topics 'Living Things and Their Habitats'. We were able to learn about the feeding habits of the otter and mongoose through an educational talk and had the opportunity to learn more about how penguins are adapted to their environment during the penguin show.

We have also been learning about materials and their properties in our new Science unit where we have been able to explore changes in materials through investigations and experiments. During Writing we have worked on our speech writing where we argued against plastic pollution and our narrative writing based on the Greek myth 'Theseus and the Minotaur' which links to our History topic for this half term focusing on what the Ancient Greeks gave up.

Our focus book for Reading has been 'Percy Jackson and the Lightening Thief' which has linked to our History topic and our narrative writing unit. The children have thoroughly enjoyed this text and its exciting twists and turns and elements of suspense.



YEAR 6 THIS TERM

This term, we worked very hard and completed our Year 6 SATS! For 3 weeks, we worked on revision of Spelling, Grammar, Maths and Reading. From 13th - 17th May we wrote our tests. Every morning, we had a SATS breakfast and then we tackled the tests. We are so proud of all of the incredible work that the pupils put into these tests-they were incredibly resilient! At the end of it, we celebrated by spending the afternoon at the Cinema, eating popcorn and watching Kung Fu Panda 2.

We've also been perfecting our NFL Flag Football skills and the pupils are getting quite good at Offense and Defense. Our current focus is writing, and we have been writing narratives and formal letters on various topics.

In History, we are finishing our unit on WW2 are excited to consolidate our knowledge on our trip to the Battle of Britain Bunker next term. Next term we are also looking forward to: PGL, Year 6 Production, Year 6 Prom and more!
