#### **NURSERY THIS TERM**

This term, nursery children were excited to start our new project: making paper. The results are amazing, and we created special Christmas cards. We have been reading "We're Going on a Bear Hunt," and the children prepared for our bear hunt with enthusiasm and lots of imagination. They have been learning the meanings of the words "under," "over," and "through."



The children have been getting to know their environments, including their homes, school, and places in the local community. They explored colours through interactions and play. Additionally, they enjoyed reading "Peace at Last," which provided an opportunity to learn about the sounds around us. The children have been looking at numbers, shapes, and different patterns.

Our last story, "The Gingerbread Man," led us into cooking. We had a lot of fun making our gingerbread men! We also created a lovely display for Remembrance Day. This term, we celebrated Diwali, Bonfire Night, and Children in Need.

## **RECEPTION THIS TERM**

This half term in Reception has been incredibly exciting for the children. They participated in various events, with one of the highlights being the Pedestrian Training, where they learned how to safely cross the road. Additionally, the children delved into the enchanting world of Fairy Tales, gaining insights from the characters' mistakes and expanding their vocabulary. They listened to different stories, re-enacted them, created props, and developed their own plays inspired by these tales.

In Maths, we deepened our understanding of numbers up to 5, as well as 2D shapes, weight, and capacity. We enjoyed reading "The Stickman" by Julia Donaldson and practiced writing sentences based on the story. In preparation for Christmas, the children wrote letters to Father Christmas, which we posted during our walk in the local area. Overall, it has been a busy and thrilling term in Reception. It has been an incredibly exciting half term in Reception. The children took part in various events that took place this half term. One of the highlights was the Pedestrian training where children learnt how to be safe when crossing the road. This half term the children also explored the magical topic of Fairy Tales, learning from the mistakes of characters and building new vocabulary. The children listened to the different tales, re-enacted them, created props for them and developed various plays based on fairy tales. In Maths this term, we developed deeper understanding of numbers to 5, 2D shapes, weight and capacity.

We have read "The Stickman" story by Julia Donaldson and practiced to hold and write a sentence based on this story. When preparing for Christmas we wrote a letter to Father Christmas which we posted ourselves during our walk to the local area. We have had a very busy and thrilling term in Reception.

#### **Pedestrian Training**

As a preparation for our first walk to local area, the Reception children have been learning how to be safe when crossing the road. The children learnt a very simple rule: "Stop, look, listen, hold hands!" that everyone should follow before crossing the road.

## **Show and Tell**

The Show and Tell Fridays have been a great success in Reception this term. The children brought their favourite toys, books, photographs and used their oracy skills to describe the object, explain where is it from, what they like to do with it, and why is it special to them. These sessions help children practice their expressive language, develop vocabulary, and build confidence when speaking in front of others. The children enjoyed sharing their favourite objects and will continue to do so for another term.



#### **YEAR 1 THIS TERM**

Year 1, have had a fantastic half term developing their knowledge and skills across all areas of the curriculum. In Maths, the children have been building their strategies to add and subtract, as well as identifying and sorting 2D and 3D shapes into different categories.

Year 1 have also made excellent progress in their word decoding skills through our daily reading sessions and enriched English program. A particular favourite book has been, 'Grandad's Island' where children re-

wrote the story changing the main character.

A real highlight this half term was our writing about our class elf, who surprised us with his antics overnight while we were sleeping. We used this excitement as inspiration for our writing, creating letters both to and about our mischievous but often kind elf. He even bought the class a book!

Our children also enjoyed creating their own stories, and our best stories were submitted to the BBC 500-Word Story competition. These stories were performed in front of the whole school, and it was a joy to see our students share their work with such confidence. Another memorable event was the Spelling Bee, where children competed against each other, in a friendly manner, to memorise our Year 1 common exception words.

In Science, this half term children compared man-made and natural materials, learning how they are produced, sourced, and used in everyday life. A key moment this term was our exciting trip to Cranford Country Park for a forest walk. During this visit, the children explored the natural environment, identifying and classifying various natural materials. They also observed human and physical features such as towering trees and the nearby motorway, deepening their understanding of the UK's landscape. Working together, they built shelters, combining teamwork with their learning about nature. This hands-on experience really brought their geography and science lessons to life.

In Design and Technology, we fostered the children's curiosity and practical skills by comparing fruits and vegetables, creating recipes, and making delicious smoothies. The children learned essential skills such as chopping, peeling, mashing, and blending. They then evaluated their drinks, discussing what they enjoyed and how they could improve their creations.

This half term, Year 1 also took part in a special pedestrian training session on road safety. The children learned to stop, look, listen, and think before crossing the road, reinforcing the importance of staying alert and cautious in traffic. They explored the meaning of traffic light colours and how these signals help keep everyone safe. Through interactive activities, the children practised making safe decisions in various road scenarios. This experience helped them develop essential life skills and a deeper understanding of road safety.



#### **YEAR 2 THIS TERM**

This term in Year 2 we have been preparing for our wonderful Christmas Production called The Boogie Woogie Nativity. It tells the story of Christmas with lots of catchy songs. We had boogie woogie angels, an animal band and much more! We invited parents to come and watch and it was a fantastic turn out.

Writing this term we have been looking at poetry and we are also looking at a diary. We have looked at the different concepts needed for a diary as well as the layout and compared it to a story to see the difference.

In maths, we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We used the knowledge we already know and built on it. We have been looking at faces, vertices and polygons. We have also been grouping shapes and working on our reasoning skills to explain our answers.

In science, we have been looking at animals and learning their names as well as their babies names comparing different types of animal babies. We have also looked at the lifecycle of a ladybird and ordering it on a diagram.

In RE this term we have been learning all about holy books in different religions. To link to this learning we went to visit the Sri Guru Singh Sabha Gurdwara in Southall. This visit gave us the opportunity to delve deeper into Sikhism and find out about their holy book the Guru Granth Sahib. We went on a tour and were able to experience how Sikh's worship their holy book and what is written inside, including listening to a verse from the book. It was such a wonderful experience for our children and we gained some great knowledge from it.





#### **YEAR 3 THIS TERM**

It's been another busy and exciting term in Year 3! Here's a quick overview of what your child has been learning:

English: The children have been diving into the world of narratives, using the story of Stone Age Boy as inspiration. They've been developing their writing skills, creating their own prehistoric adventures while focusing on story structure, character development, and using descriptive language to bring their stories to life.

Reading: We have been reading Stig of the Dump. The children have loved finding out about the adventures Barney has got into with Stig and answering questions all about it. Maths: In Maths, we've been building our skills in addition and subtraction. The children have been working with both mental and written methods to solve a range of problems, including using number lines and word problems. They've also been exploring the relationship between addition and subtraction to strengthen their understanding.

Art: Our creative streak continued in Art as the children explored prehistoric times by making their very own Stone Age pots. We also collected nature from the local area to inspire patterns for our pots.

Music: In Music, the children have been introduced to rhythm and beats through R&B music. They've been exploring different patterns and rhythms, learning about the instruments commonly used in this genre, and even experimenting musical activities. We learnt a song on Charanga and practiced singing it as a class.

Geography: In Geography, we've been learning about settlements, focusing on how people lived in the past and how settlements have evolved over time. The children have been exploring different types of settlements and their features, from ancient villages to modern cities.

PSHE: We have been thinking carefully all about 'valuing difference'. We have learnt about respect and communities.



#### **YEAR 4 THIS TERM**

What a fabulous and busy term we've had in Year Four! We started off the term with our new reading unit based on the book The Lion Above the Door by Onjali Q. Raúf. We thoroughly enjoyed reading this historical fiction text and learning more about the Royal Air Force (RAF). This seamlessly led into our understanding of Remembrance Day this term and why many countries around the world honour this significant day.

We also celebrated No Pens Day, where we didn't write at all. Instead, we focused on our oracy skills. We pretended to be evening news anchors and reported on the mammals found in our oceans. Following that, we created paper boats for our writing unit based on the book Float by Daniel Miyares. This story is about a boy who makes a paper boat, but a terrible storm comes and ruins it—an experience that mirrored our own as we imagined ourselves as the character in the story.

In art, we completed our unit focused on the Welsh artist Gwen John. Our final pieces were created using new sketching techniques and blending colours with oil pastels. Next, we moved into our favourite learning of the term: Design and Technology, where we created our own tartlets. We had a lot of fun learning about eating a balanced diet, developing our very own flavour profiles, crafting recipes, and then making the pastry and filling. It was a whole lot of fun—and delicious, too!

We finished the term with a trip to the Compass Theatre to watch a pantomime based on Snow White. It was a delightful experience and a wonderful way to wrap up the term.





## **YEAR 5 THIS TERM**

On the last day of Autumn 1, Year 5 went to Legoland to do a workshop about gravity and friction - then we tested our new knowledge by going on some of the amazing rides. In Reading and Writing, we studied the book Cosmic (which helped us consolidate some of our knowledge on space). In DT, we created Automatons and worked in the new woodshop. We also had the opportunity to go to St. Peter and Paul's Church to see how Christians celebrate Christmas. We have loved all of the exciting things we have done (including learning the words to the Fresh

Prince of Bel Air in Music). We're looking forward to next term!













## **YEAR 6 THIS TERM**

#### **Year 6 Christmas Market**

The Year 6 students participated in the second annual Christmas Market. They spent a day brainstorming and creating products to sell at the market. One group baked various treats, including chocolate pinecones and cake pops, while another group made Christmas cards and ornaments. All the goods were sold at the Christmas Market on December 16th, and the proceeds will go towards end-of-year activities for the Year 6 pupils.



#### **YEAR 6 THIS TERM**

Our William Byrd Christmas Choir has had a busy season! The choir, consisting of 32 dedicated pupils selected from a larger group, rehearsed tirelessly for several events:
