

School Parliament and Head Pupil

Terms of Reference

- 1. Three pupils from each group (Year 1 5) will make up the School Parliament. Three pupils from Year 6 will be appointed as Head Students and will lead the Parliament.
- 2. Meetings will be held once a week on Tuesdays at 14:45 in 4P.
- 3. Members of Parliament are expected to hold a clinic at lunchtime at least once a month on a rotation to allow pupils express their concerns and feedback. This will take place in **The House of Byrds.**
- 4. Members of Parliament are expected to feedback any information from their meetings to their year groups in a timely manner.
- 5. Members of Parliament will be responsible for visitor tours and may be asked to participate in external interviews or meetings.
- 6. Members of Parliament will be responsible for reading over applications for other school leaders, deliberating over the applications and appointing pupils to the roles. These roles include:

 - S.T.E.M. Leaders
 - Sports Leaders
 - Lunchtime Leaders
 - Eco-leaders

- 7. Each Member of Parliament is expected to participate in a school improvement project either one that was proposed in their manifesto or one voted on at the School Parliament meetings.
